



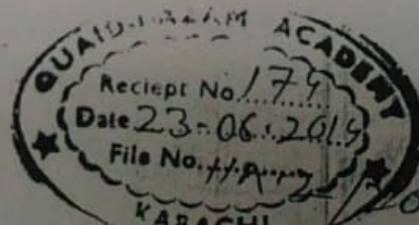

R E S O L U T I O N

SUBJECT: ESTABLISHMENT OF QAUID-I-AZAM ACADEMY AS AN  
AUTONOMOUS BODY UNDER THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION.

No.P.2-21/75-GEN. In consequence of a decision taken by the National Committee and the Executive Committee for the Birth Centenary Celebrations of Quaid-i-Azam Mohammad Ali Jinnah, the Federal Government has decided to establish the Quaid-i-Azam Academy as an autonomous body under the direct administrative control of the Ministry of Education. The Academy would undertake the projects devoted to promotion of studies and research on various aspects of Quaid-i-Azam's life, works and achievements as also on the cultural, social, economic and political aspects of the history of Pakistan. The Academy would undertake such projects and perform such functions as are approved by its Board of Governors, its Chairman, or its Executive Committee.

The Academy would have a Board of Governors with the following composition:-
